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## 1. Introduction to ESC Pau

Established in 1969, ESC Pau has the reputation for being quite an original *Grande Ecole de Management*.

The School has a distinctive human dimension to it, which puts students at the centre of its projects. The School's roots are to be found in the Atlantic Ocean and the Pyrenees Mountains, representative of a way of life, a way of thinking and a certain way of doing things.

There are just over 1,000 students at ESC Pau, located on the Pau University Campus which houses a multi-disciplinary, international community of nearly 15,000 students.

Our mission is "to release the potential and identity of future business managers, who are open and passionate change agents adapted to a constantly shifting business environment".

We are a motivated, international academic community made up of 28 full-time professors, and 143 part-time professors from the world of business.



## 2. Introduction to Pau

ESC Pau is located in the heart of a university campus of around 13 000 students.

Homeland of Henri IV, king of France and Navarre, and Bernadotte, king of Sweden, Pau is today known for its cultural and historic wealth.

Pau is located between the Atlantic coast and the Pyrenees mountains. It is in the Aquitaine region and has around 135,000 inhabitants. It is about 120 km from the Atlantic coast (Biarritz and the Basque Coast and also the Landes beaches) and a short drive from the Spanish border. Bordeaux and Toulouse are about 200 km away, whilst Saragosse and Bilbao are about 250 km away.



Pau and its region are home to numerous companies from different business sectors: Total (oil industry), Rhône-Poulenc (petrochemicals), Pau-Euralis (agriculture), 3A, Fromagerie des Chaumes, Lindt & Sprüngli (food processing), Turboméca, Messier-Dowty (aeronautics), Décathlon (sport), Leclerc, Carrefour, Auchan and Intermarché (hypermarkets), and many more.

The Basque coast is renowned for its excellent surf beaches and hosts many international competitions. Pau is also well located for skiing with resorts like Gourette, Artouste, La Pierre Saint Martin and Cauterets just an hour or so away. The Béarn-Basque region also has numerous golf courses and the first 18 hole course in Europe was created in Pau by the English in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Potholing, trekking, climbing and kayaking activities are also within easy reach.

Pau is a centre for culture and sport and the Zenith concert hall (6,500 places) is host to many concerts of national and international renown. For sport, the Pau-Orthez basketball team plays at the Palais des Sports (the second biggest after Paris-Bercy with 7500 places) and Pau has an excellent national rugby team. Pau also has a recently renovated national horse racecourse with regular meetings from December to March. For motor-racing, Pau is host to the Grand Prix Automobile in May and is often an arrival or departure stage for the famous cycling event "Le Tour de France".

### 3. Weather

Pau has a mild climate whose benefits were first discovered by the English during the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The summer is generally hot and temperatures can easily reach 30° C. The average temperature in July is about 19.4° C. The hot weather continues until autumn, sometimes until November. Winters in Pau are generally mild with lots of sunny days. Only occasionally will temperatures drop to -2/-3° C or colder. Thanks to its southern position, days are 50 minutes longer than in Paris during the winter. The spring is normally rainy. We recommend you to bring a mixture of light and winter clothes.

## 4. Travel to Pau

### 1 – Flying from Paris to Pau

Pau is 750 km (450 miles) from Paris. There are 7 daily return flights between Paris and Pau. The trip takes 75 minutes.

Planes leave from Orly Ouest airport or Roissy Charles de Gaulle airport.

If you land at Roissy Charles de Gaulle airport and you need to reach Orly Ouest, we recommend you to take the Air France Shuttle (bus) <http://www.shuttle-paris.com/> which leaves every 20 minutes from Roissy Charles de Gaulle airport to Orly from 6.00 am to 11.00 pm. The bus trip normally takes 50 minutes but may be much longer depending on traffic conditions in Paris.

If you fly with Air France, you can get a free bus ticket at the Air France desk located in the airport.

If you are under 25, you will get 25% off your tickets. You can also buy a **Carte 12-25** (it costs 49 euros) to get up to 60% discounts on all your trips during your stay. You will require a passport sized photo for this card.

If you come by train from Spain also check [www.renfe.es](http://www.renfe.es) If you book online at least 2 weeks in advance, you can get up to 60% off Spanish tickets at the French border.

If your flight arrives in Barcelona, you can also come to Pau by bus via Toulouse and then take a two-hour train from Toulouse Station to Pau.

# Settling down in PAU

## 1– How to get to Groupe ESC Pau

From Pau Train Station you can take the free funicular to the Boulevard des Pyrénées then, after a short walk, take bus number 4 or 6. Buses leave from the Pole Bosquet, Place d’Espagne and stop a few minutes walk from ESC Pau.

You may also take a taxi (approximately 20 €).

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If you let us know the date, time and flight number in advance, we may be able to pick you up at the airport or at the Railway Station.

## 2 - City transport in Pau

This is managed by the S.T.A.P (Société des Transports de l'Agglomération Paloise).

The S.T.A.P office is located at Place d'Espagne in Pau

You can buy individual tickets from the bus driver. Fares cost 1.10 euro.

You may also buy 4 tickets (at the S.T.A.P office or in a tobacco shop – “TABAC”) which you can use for 8 trips. These 4 tickets cost 5.60 euros and are valid until you have used both sides.

You may also buy a card called the “Campus card” for students (under 26 years old). To do so, you will have to bring a passport-sized identity photograph as well as an enrolment certificate, or your student identity card.

A weekly card costs 7.40 euros (valid from Monday to Sunday).

A monthly card costs 18.50 euros (valid from the first day to the last day of each month).

A three-monthly card costs 54.00 euros (usable from the first day of each month to the last day of 3 months after – for example from 1<sup>st</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> March)

We recommend these only if you intend to take the bus everyday.

A city transport map will be given to you when you arrive.

From Pau town centre to ESC Pau take bus number 4 (“Zenith” direction) from *Place d'Espagne - Pôle Bosquet* and stop at “Saint John Perse”.

From ESC Pau to Pau town centre, go to the main road (avenue Lucien Fabre) outside ESC Pau, cross the road and take the bus number 4 (“Lons - Pesqué” direction) and stop at “Pôle Bosquet”.

**5 – Going Skiing:** If you want to go skiing during your stay in Pau, here is some useful information to go to Gourette ski resort in the Pyrenees:

- At the train station, take bus 8 to go to Gourette (Pyrenees)
  - o Bus schedule (be careful the bus stop is at the train station):
    - Departure from the bus stop: 7h35, arrives Gourette 9h00
    - Departure from the bus stop: 11h25, arrives Gourette 12h50
    - Departure from the bus stop: 12h50, arrives Gourette 14h15

Bus ticket for one trip, one person 6€

Bus ticket for one trip, five people 27€

Bus ticket for one trip, ten people 45€

- At Gourette, you can take the BEZOU cable car up to an altitude of 1,600m in 3-4 minutes

A return cable car ticket costs 6€

- To come back to Pau, take bus 8
  - o Bus schedule:
    - Departure from Gourette 9h45, arrives Pau train station 11h10
    - Departure from Gourette 13h15, arrives Pau train station 14h40
    - Departure from Gourette 17h30, arrives Pau train station 18h55

Bus ticket for one trip, one person 6€

Bus ticket for one trip, five people 27€

Bus ticket for one trip, ten people 45€

If you need to rent skis or snowboards you can do it on site at Gourette.

Another option would be the following:

You can enrol for up to 3 sports activities for 20 euros at *La Maison des Etudiants* on the university campus (9h00 – 16h30 mid September to mid October, then 12h00 – 14h00).

Additionally for skiing you pay 20 euros each time you go to the ski resort (Gourette or Luz/Cauterets...) it includes a return trip on the bus, skis, ski boots and lift tickets for the day – Saturdays only)

#### 4 – Accommodation

If you already have accommodation in Pau, please let us know. Otherwise, we suggest the following solutions:

- ✓ Individual room in the University Dorm / University Residence  
From 130 € to 230 € per month depending on the type of accommodation (utility costs included), but you will also need to pay a deposit equivalent to 1 month's rent. Once you leave, we will reimburse your deposit provided you have not caused any damage to the room

**Please note that rent is payable by Bank Cheque per semester; monthly rates should therefore be multiplied x 5 for the Spring Semester (Jan-May) and x 4 for the Fall Semester (Sept-Dec).**

- ✓ Private accommodation:  
Be aware that a furnished and equipped apartment / studio costs approximately 350 € / 500 € per month. You will be required to provide a deposit which is equivalent to 2 months' rent. Once you leave, the owner will reimburse your deposit as long as you have not caused any damage to the apartment.

Monthly estimated budget: 600 € per month.

## 10 – Cost of living

This is an estimated break down of costs:

Food: approximately 150 € / month

Accommodation: from 130 to 500 € / month + maintenance charges

Transport: 20 € / month

Personal expenses:

- movies : (student rate) : 3,50 €
- restaurant : from 9,20 to 22 €
- a coffee in a bar costs 1,30 € and a glass of beer costs from 2,50 to 4,00 €

## 11 - Internet connection

All students have unlimited access to the internet as well as a personal e-mail address provided by Groupe ESC Pau.

Your personal e-mail address and your password will be given to you a few days after your arrival.

To get a private internet connection at your accommodation you should see NEUF [www.neuf.fr](http://www.neuf.fr), or ORANGE [www.orange.fr](http://www.orange.fr) etc. Most of the internet offers include wi-fi internet connection (you can share it between other students who live with you), telephone and TV. For monthly internet access with SFR via fibre optic cable, the current rate is 34.90 euros. If you want to have a personal cable internet connection only, check the Student Offers (25 euros per month at NEUF, but you will have to sign at least a 9 month contract).

# Before and after your arrival

## 1- Certificate of enrollment and student identity card

A few days after your arrival, the Groupe ESC Pau Admin Office will provide you with a certificate of enrollment and a student identity card. You should send us a good quality passport photo by email before your arrival.

## 2- Student Residence Permit for non European citizens only

Unless your visa says “**exempté de Carte de séjour**”, the second step you must take within 3 months of arrival in France is to get your temporary student residence permit.

This is a compulsory document you will have to keep with you during your stay in France.

The validity of this permit cannot extend beyond the duration of your studies in France.

Here is the list of documents you must submit to the Prefecture to obtain a residence permit (***please make sure that you obtain them before your departure for Pau***):

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- **your passport** containing a **long-term visa** as well as a photocopy of each page which has been written on or stamped
- **3 identity photographs** (we recommend you to obtain them here because of the special size requested)
- **An original birth certificate** (this needs to be translated into French) as well as a photocopy of it. If your birth certificate is written in English you will have to submit a French version translated and stamped by an expert translator, such as the Alliance Française (this may cost you 15 to 30 euros).
- **Proof of your financial resources** equivalent to at least 500 euros per month. This document can be a parental agreement (see annex 1) or a certificate from your bank showing that your bank account has sufficient funds to cover all expenses during your stay in France.
- **Proof that you have health insurance.** You will automatically be affiliated to the French medical insurance scheme (Social Security) if you have never subscribed. Be aware that the cost for 1 year is around 192 euros payable in one installment. It is also recommended that you subscribe to a complementary social security scheme (monthly payments) called a “Mutuelle”. For details, go to [www.lmde.com](http://www.lmde.com) or [www.vittavi.fr](http://www.vittavi.fr)
- **Proof of residency** in the Pau area (this document will be provided by ESC Pau upon your arrival)
- Groupe ESC Pau **certificate of enrollment** (provided by ESC Pau upon your arrival)
- **An envelope** with your name and address in Pau, bearing a 1<sup>st</sup> class stamp.

Please note that a medical visit is compulsory for non European citizens. The Prefecture will arrange an appointment for you to meet a doctor and will notify you by post.

You will first get a receipt which proves that you are a “regular” foreign student. The final card will be issued approximately 3 months later.

Please note that the renewal of your residence permit has to be done at least 2 months before the expiry date of your card.

For non European students who would normally require a Schengen Visa to travel around Europe, please bear in mind that a French Student Visa is VALID ONLY IN FRANCE and you won't be able to travel out of the country. For travel around Europe for non European students who won't require a residence permit: If you require a Schengen Visa for traveling around Europe because of your nationality, be aware that a French Student Visa is VALID ONLY IN FRANCE, and you won't be able to travel out of the country. If you want to travel around Europe, we strongly recommend you get a Schengen Visa before your departure (you can apply for it in any European country embassy in your country).

For all students applying for the residence permit, once you have obtained it you will be able to travel around EU during the validity of this document.

### **3 – Medical insurance**

Affiliation to the French Social Security system is compulsory for non European citizens unless they are already affiliated to a medical insurance company in their home country.

If you need insurance, we recommend you either subscribe through our agent [Herve.Petit-Brisson@gan.fr](mailto:Herve.Petit-Brisson@gan.fr) before leaving your country or contact him once you arrive. Note that we can plan an appointment with him for you.

If necessary, the Central Administration of Groupe ESC Pau will give you a certificate of enrollment upon your arrival.

### **4 – Accommodation allowance**

The French *Caisse d'Allocations Familiales* (CAF) offers financial aid to students and low income earners in order to reduce their accommodation costs. This is only valid for students who hold the Residence Permit (*Carte de Séjour*)

Here is the list of documents which required by the CAF in order to be eligible for such an allowance:

- Photocopy of your resident's permit
- Proof of residence in the area of Pau (rental bill, utility bill...)
- Financial resources of the previous year (special form from the CAF to be filled in)
- Copy of your birth certificate translated in French (or an international one)
- Your French bank account number
- Copy of your visa

If you share an apartment with other students of the same sex as you, each of you should fill in an individual application.

If you share an apartment with a student of different sex, you should fill in only one application, because you will be considered as a couple by the administration.

Please note that considering the huge number of applications, you may get your allowance after the end of your stay in Pau.

### **5- Opening a bank account in France**

Here is the list of documents requested to open a bank account:

- a passport,
- a certificate of enrollment at Groupe ESC Pau,
- proof of residence in Pau

Depending on the bank, you may also be required to provide the following:

- a bank certificate or letter which indicates that your bank account in your country of residence is funded **(to be obtained before your departure)**,
- a parental agreement if your parents intend to make a monthly bank transfer (see annex 1 - **(to be obtained before your departure)**),

## 6- Getting a telephone line

If you want to get a telephone line during your stay, we recommend you get a pre-paid mobile phone:

You can get one in different stores like “Telephonie E.Leclerc” near to the school where you will be able to choose from different operators (Orange, Bouygues, SFR, etc)

Note that if you want to make a call abroad (from France) you need to dial “00” followed by the national and regional number of your correspondent.

For instance: 00 (+ country code + regional and local number)

If you want to receive a telephone call in France from abroad, your correspondent will need to dial the following numbers:

00 33 (followed by your mobile telephone number, minus the first 0)

**Other useful information:**

- Power electricity in France  
It is 220v. and the plugs probably will be a little bit different from what you use in your home country, we suggest you bring some adaptors to be able you to use your computer or other electronic equipment properly (European plugs are not flat).
- Buying a Bike in Pau  
If you would like to buy a bike in Pau, you have two choices, get a brand new bike or a 2<sup>nd</sup> hand one in Decathlon or EMAUS at Lescar. To go to Lescar from Pau take the bus line 8 until the stop at Quartier Libre.
